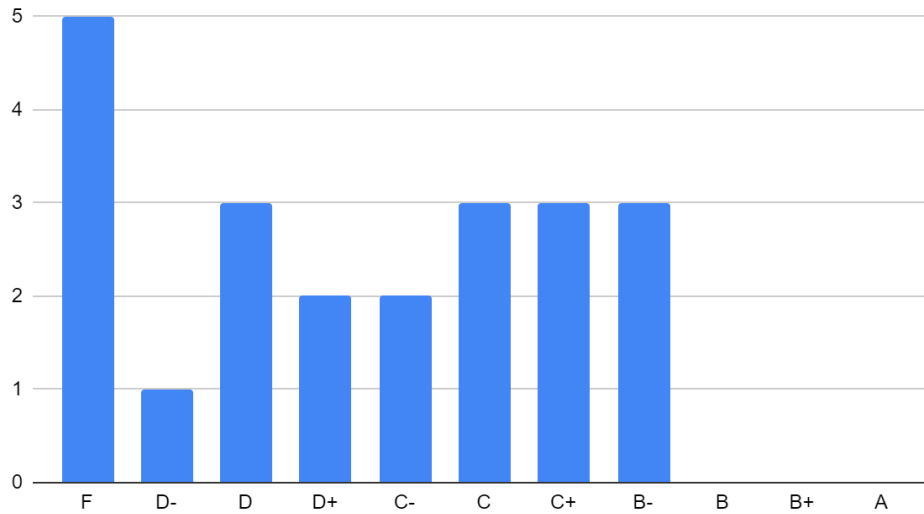




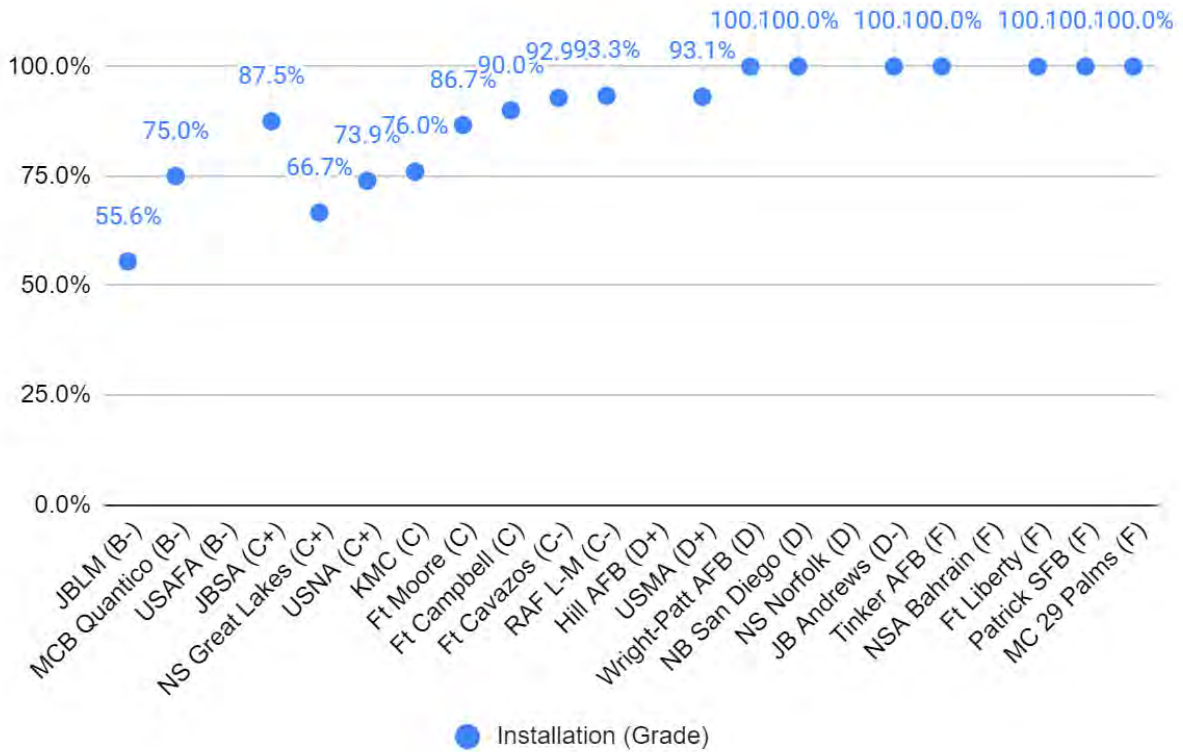
# Histogram of Installation Grades

# Summary Results

Overall, MAAF surveyed **26 installation chaplaincy activities, around the world, in all branches**. Four (4) installations were excluded due to lack of publicized services. Among these facilities, MAAF found advertised **342 weekly services. Of those weekly services, 304 (88.9%) were Christian**. And among those installations, the **median percentage of weekly Christian services was 93.0%**. It is unclear how a chaplaincy committed to diversity could advertise almost exclusively Christian services.

**The Median grade earned was 1.5, between D+ and C-. This score reflected the strong bias toward Christian services to the exclusion of non-Christian services.** Five (5) installations, over 22% of those graded earned an F grade due to having not only exclusively Christian services but additional negative mitigating factors. The highest grades were B-, earned by 3 installations with a number of diversity programs. None earned higher grades because the bias was always to Christianity and none mentioned humanist or other nontheist programs.

There were several highlights: The US Air Force Academy has the SPIRE program focusing on diversity for cadets. This program has the serious flaw of excluding nontheists but is otherwise a positive model for diversity. Joint Base Lewis-McChord services were almost 50-50 Christian versus non-Christian services. Though it may happen that the majority of attendees go to Christian services, the count of services themselves being closer to 50-50 makes sense since there are many non-Christian beliefs to serve on the installation. Navy Recruit Command featured “self-directed time” which is a concession to nontheists but falls short because it does not re-establish a successful nontheist service that existed there for several years with 60 or more attendees weekly.

## Methodology

MAAF has surveyed public presences of chaplaincy operations at major installations around the world. While these public advertisements don't always reflect the current activities at installations, they should do so and are in any case an official public expression of chaplain priorities. What services a chaplain office chooses to publicly advertise says what they prioritize

in their face-to-face activities. And, to the extent chaplain offices find these public expressions not to represent their true priorities, MAAF invites them to update these public expressions so that we can see new priorities in future surveys. (see References for source and date of access)

This survey focuses on a number of ‘chaplaincy’ activities from installation chapels to unit ministries groups to social media. These selections are from some of the largest installations and prominent activities. If these important chaplaincy activities are unconcerned with diversity, how could smaller operations find the time or budget? If these public presences speak almost exclusively to Christianity, why should a non-Christian trust a chaplain; why should military leaders trust non-Christians with chaplains? Surely saying ‘we support diversity’ is not enough for chaplains to be trusted with service members. Find your activities in the list below and see how that matches what you see in practice. **Don’t see your installation? Contact MAAF to have it considered for the next round. See your installation and want to improve your score? Contact MAAF for materials and assistance in how to improve your public outreach to nontheists and other underserved communities.**

This survey is inspired by the current demographics of chaplaincy, which have fewer than 3% non-Christian chaplains. This implies but certainly does not prove a bias and unwillingness to serve non-Christians. MAAF is investigating to see if where these Christians fall on the spectrum of promotion of their own personal Christian beliefs versus the more desirable expression of concern for and outreach to diverse religious beliefs found among their military population.

Whatever the results below may show, MAAF would expect from the chaplaincy services a regular diversity outreach program, at the least, to reach those underserved communities. And, over time, one would expect several communities to come together to build, with chaplain support, regular weekly meetings for specific faith and belief traditions, outside the more common weekly Christian services. There are non-Christians among the population. If the chaplains aren’t serving them, it is for the chaplains, the commissioned, paid professionals, not that underserved population of lay persons to remedy the situation.

*Assessment Note: MAAF has assigned simple letter grades for easy review. These are subjective but should be justified based on the review conducted and evidence provided. A indicates a successful effort by the chaplaincy to serve all, resulting in a number of diverse programs. B indicates effort by the chaplaincy to serve all with limited but active diversity programs. C indicates an apparent intention by the chaplaincy to serve all but no clear success in reaching the diverse community with active programs. D indicates limited effort or only lip-service to diversity and a focus on one belief over others. F indicates promotion of one belief over others with no apparent concern for diversity. Note that a standard ‘Sunday services’ Christian chaplaincy will earn a D while an F implies exclusive Christianity plus active promotion. Grades are translated to a 0-4 point scale for statistical aggregation.*

## Summary Results - Detailed

### Naval Base San Diego - Grade D

Naval Base San Diego has a limited presence with a passively inclusive vision statement. That is to say they purport to serve all yet advertise 2 services, 1 Protestant and 1 Catholic on the website plus 1 additional Christian service on the Facebook page. There is no explicit listing of any non-Christian service or offering. The statement of inclusivity rings hollow when accompanied by exclusively Christian services. The NSBD Chapel Facebook posted almost daily, signed by “Chaps Luff”, a standard posting with a secular quote, a Bible verse, and a prayer to God by the chaplain. An otherwise-secular quote becomes Christian when subordinate to a Bible verse and Christian prayer. Older posts also included videos of Christian worship services.

## US Navy Recruit Training Command - Grade C

US Navy Recruit Training Command at Naval Station Great Lakes has the Recruit Memorial Chapel as its main facility. The main page claims, “an array of faith tradition services are offered each weekend, utilizing chaplain, uniformed military, and civilian volunteer worship leaders.” Fourteen religious traditions are listed, 5 of which are not Christian. The picture posted on the main page notably features no explicitly Christian images. Explicitly nontheistic beliefs are not listed. Also listed is a 930-1030 time for “self-directed time” where materials are available for reflection. The presence of this self-directed time is encouraging, though that puts the requirement on the young trainee to stand out, speak up, and provide for themselves during that time, so it should be improved with more scheduled services.

MAAF Note (not accounted for in the grading above): MAAF supported a volunteer at Naval Basic Training for weekly humanist services for 2 years before the program was shut down due to COVID. Our volunteer, a Navy veteran, overcame frequent bureaucratic challenges and opposition to continue the program until he had to step back. The training center has not recently reached out for any volunteer support or materials.

## Naval Station Norfolk, VA - Grade D

Naval Station Norfolk website has minimal information but mentions Christian, Jewish, and Islamic services explicitly and offers to “facilitate” (quotes on the website) other traditions. The site also lists a Facebook page for more information. The page has only 4 (non-blank) posts in 2023. Two are Christian holiday posts and 2 are not just Christian videos by proselytizing videos by the chaplain to recruit viewers to Christianity.

## Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego, CA - Grade N/A

No public presence found.

## Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island, SC - Grade N/A

The page had one simple page advertising a “nondenominational” (read: Christian) service on Thursdays. This doesn’t reach out but really doesn’t provide any useful information to work with and so was not graded. However, for a recruit location, it is even more important for services to be advertised publicly so recruits can better prepare.



## Marine Corps Base Quantico, VA - Grade B-

The Quantico site has a table of services including 6 Christian services (including senior leader Bible study), 2 Muslim services, and resources listed for Jewish, Buddhist (and Christian-Mormon and an annual children's Bible retreat.) services. Quantico gets credit for active and varied diversity programs, but not full credit as services are not active and do not include diversity such as naturalistic (eg, Wiccan) or nontheistic (eg, Humanist) traditions.

## Marine Corps 29 Palms, CA - Grade F

Marine Corps 29 Palms, formally known as Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command and Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center advertises at least 18 different weekly services, mostly Catholic with 3 Protestant services, exclusively Christian, with no mention of non-Christians. These are also listed only under the "Catholic Chapel" and "Protestant Chapel". There is a note for general use of the chapel, but all active services and outreach are built around an assumption of Christianity.

## Joint Base San Antonio, TX - Grade B-

Joint Base San Antonio, also home to Air Force Basic Training, lists 32 weekly services across 8 facilities. Of the 32, 28 are Christian, 2 are Muslim, 1 Jewish, and 1 Buddhist. There are also two Christian youth groups listed. We see good diversity across the 'in-group' beliefs but no services for or even mention of Humanist, Wiccan or other lower diversity groups. Also, with over 87% of services dedicated to Christians, there is plenty of room to expand.

## Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, OH - Grade D

Wright-Patt lists 10 weekly Christian services. There is a spot to contact chapel staff for "additional faith group information." This would be the perfect spot for active outreach to those many faith groups which are not served or mentioned on the page.

## Tinker Air Force Base, OK - Grade F

Tinker AFB lists 14 weekly services among various other special or monthly services and ministries. It is good to see a robust Christian presence, but with no service to or mention of non-Christians the message seems to be that chaplains actively and exclusively promote Christianity with active disregard for non-Christians.

## Hill Air Force Base, UT - Grade D+

Hill Air Force Base had an unclear online presence, in terms of what was official or even current. MAAF surveyed hill.af.mil, facebook, and a private 'Beacons' website. Only weekly Christian services were mentioned with one monthly Jewish service. However, the private website is notably linked to the Armed Forces Heathen Society. This was a refreshing acknowledgement to diversity, but with a hard-to-find only presence and no diversity on the official website or facebook page (recently), it was hard to give much credit for this review.

## Patrick Space Force Base, FL - Grade F

Patrick Space Force Base, the main headquarters for the newest branch, lists 10 weekly services, all Christian. There are also a number of periodic offerings such as vacation bible school and retreats, as well as dedicated Catholic and Protestant facebook pages. There doesn't seem to be any concern outside Christian offerings.

## Joint Base Andrews, MD - Grade D-

Joint Base Andrews advertises 14 weekly services, all Christian. They notably advertise the presence of a Muslim Prayer room and a Meditation room, as well as opportunities for other faith groups. No weekly services are attached, but this shows at least openness to the idea, at least of a Muslim service. It would not be difficult to expand the verbiage to welcome, by name, other beliefs, and to expand on the chaplains' desire to connect with and serve. The Facebook page posts seem to be all Christian weekly services and the occasional Christian ministry advertisement.

## Fort Liberty, NC - Grade F

Ft Liberty (formerly Ft Bragg) installation chaplains, across 10 chapels and 30 weekly services, advertise exclusively Christian services, with no mention at all of non-Christian services or service members. One chapel advertises an overt evangelical "Pastoral Vision" for the chapel.

## Fort Moore, GA - Grade C

Ft Moore, formerly Ft Benning, is home to ground and airborne infantry training. The chaplain office lists 12 facilities and 9 weekly services as well as 8 religious education services. The list does not seem to be comprehensive, but a fair interpretation seems to be 15 weekly services, 13 Christian, 1 Muslim, and 1 Jewish.

## Fort Cavazos, TX - Grade C-

Fort Cavazos, formerly Fort Hood, is a large installation in Texas. It boasts 13 facilities and 42 services. This is a robust chaplaincy operation, but of those 42 services only 3 are non-Christian, 1 each for Buddhist, Jewish, and Muslim. Pagan is listed, which is almost unheard-of in our survey, but regular services are not scheduled, just a contact person. The large imbalance hurts the appearance of equity in support.

## Joint Base Lewis-McChord, WA - Grade B-

Joint Base Lewis-McChord, JBLM, is in the Seattle area. The website boasts 9 facilities including services with Jewish, Islamic, Buddhist, and Wiccan. However, the actual schedule lists 19 weekly services, all of which are Christian. 15 are Christian but 4 represent diversity including Wiccan. However, nontheists are not represented.

## Ft Campbell, KY - Grade C

Fort Campbell lists 8 facilities and 30 weekly services, 27 of which are Christian. There was 1 weekly service each for Jewish, Muslim, and Pagan. Diversity is present but there is a strong bias toward robust and expansive Christian services with token support for diversity. The verbiage on the chaplain website includes a few comments “the presence of Chaplains in the ranks of the military since 1775 is a testimony to the central role faith, has” and “Unless the soldier's soul sustains him, he cannot be relied upon.” While these quotes may be ok, they seem to be derogatory of Soldiers not expressing religion according to chaplain desires or what may have been prominent in the military of 1775. This is exclusive to many service members.

## US Military Academy, West Point, NY - Grade D+

USMA West Point chaplaincy website features 7 chaplaincy facilities, including a World Religious Worship Center. The webpages associated with the facilities advertise 28 services, 27 of which are Christian. (Day care and choir services are not included). A more dedicated Religious Service Schedule advertises 11 weekly services at 9 different facilities including in the local town of Highland Falls. The World Religious Worship Center page says ‘come back for more info’ implying a lack of concern for the facility relative to others, but on the Service Schedule, the facility is listed as hosting a Muslim Service. The two lists together seem to indicate the use of 9 facilities for 29 services, 27 of which are Christian, with one Jewish and one Muslim Service. There are a few diverse services but the vast majority of focus seems to be on Christianity with a missed opportunity to talk about the World Religious Worship Center or use it as some sort of diversity facility.

## US Naval Academy, MD - Grade C-

The US Naval Academy chaplaincy website is organized into faith communities. There are 4 communities listed, 2 Christian with 10 services, Jewish with 1 service, and Muslim with 5 services. There is also a Religious Education section with 7 weekly Christian services and an appointment-only Jewish service. In total, this would be 23 weekly services, with 6 non-Christian services. The grade is assigned based on this larger proportion of non-Christian services relative to others; however, the Naval Academy has an active Satanist (humanist beliefs not occult Satanist) community among others that are explicitly not listed for support and outreach and are omitted from the USNA Religious Organizations list which includes 14 organizations, 12 of which are Christian.

## US Air Force Academy, CO - Grade B-

The Air Force Academy boasts a Protestant chapel as a primary landmark and icon, prominently featuring Christianity. However, under this chapel are Catholic and Jewish facilities. There is also a Wiccan prayer circle unique among all general use chaplaincy facilities in being built in other-than the Christian style of altar+pews. Other facilities were built with private funds. USAFA has a wonderful Spiritual Life program featuring a diversity of beliefs including an Other Faiths placeholder. This could be a model but for the exclusion of nontheists.

A USAFA professor has served as Officer In Charge for many years to steward programs for nontheists and that seems to be reflected in an uncommon reference to cadets of 'no-faith'. Unfortunately, that off-hand reference is not reflective of that volunteer's work or those cadets' needs. The chaplain page also boasts a "religious and morale-boosting retreat for their faith group every year" which has never been offered to nontheists. The USAFA program features diversity that excludes nontheists and this is not a supportive or sustainable model.

## Area Support Group Kuwait - Grade N/A

Camp Arifjan, more formally Area Support Group Kuwait, provides a nice summary of the chaplaincy mission to support to nurture the living, care for the wounded, and honor the dead, as well as to advise on religious support issues related to the local population. However, there is no grade as there seem to be no services listed, social media, or posts.

## Yokota Air Base, Japan - Grade N/A

Despite being a large base in Japan which certainly has a chaplaincy operation, there seems to be no mention of chaplaincy.

## Kaiserslautern Military Community, Germany - Grade C

Kaiserslautern Military Community (KMC) including Ramstein Air Base and a few other installations in the local area is a large US military presence in southwest Germany. KMC advertises 4 facilities with 31 services. Of these services, 25 are Christian. The remaining 6 are 2 Muslim services and 1 each are Jewish, Buddhist, Wiccan, and Unitarian Universalist. This constitutes broad diversity though the vast majority (80%) are Christian and none are Humanist.

## RAF Lakenheath and Mildenhall, UK - Grade C-

Royal Air Force (RAF) Lakenheath and its partner installation RAF Mildenhall are in the UK and refer to the UK's Royal Air Force. However, as evidenced by the af.mil source address, they are treated as US installations as well and have Chapels for each. 15 weekly services are listed. 14 are Christian and 1 is Pagan. Jewish services are listed but not scheduled.

## Naval Support Activity Bahrain - Grade F

Naval Support Activity Bahrain is in Bahrain, a Muslim country. It is a difficult assignment and can be isolated especially for non-Muslims. The chaplaincy presence is difficult to find and with limited information. The site mentions Christian services briefly and links to a blank page. An internet search reveals what seems to be an official NSA Bahrain Facebook page that only rebroadcasts Christian services.

Religious services are conducted at the Recruit Memorial Chapel regularly on Friday evenings and Sunday mornings and on special religious Holy days. An array of faith tradition services are offered each weekend, utilizing chaplain, uniformed military, and civilian volunteer worship leaders.

In caring for all, RTC Chaplains are available for individual counsel at the recruit memorial chapel. Recruits requesting to speak with a chaplain may do so through their chain of command. Staff may contact their chaplain or the RTC Chapel directly.

As an extension of care, a duty chaplain is available 24 hours a day/7 days a week to handle any urgent needs that our staff and recruits may encounter.

The RTC RMD also participates in recruit training by providing instruction on the Navy Core Values (Honor, Courage, Commitment), and Operational Stress Control.



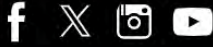

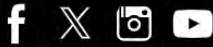

# Cadet Chapel



The Cadet Chapel is a famous landmark and symbol of religious activities of the Military Academy and was designed by the renowned firm of Cram, Goodhue, and Ferguson. Dedicated in 1910 and constructed of native granite, this building blends naturally into the surrounding landscape. The architecture combines the techniques and shapes of Gothic with the massiveness of medieval fortresses. This architectural theme subsequently dominated the other construction at West Point.

The Cadet Chapel organ (M.P. Moeller,) begun in 1911 and enlarged by memorial gifts is now the largest church organ in the world. The Organist and Director of Music is Mr. Craig Williams. Craig Williams and other artists perform concerts throughout the year.

The stained glass windows have been executed by the Willet Studios of Philadelphia. The great Sanctuary Window, inscribed with the words of the motto of the Academy, "Duty, Honor, Country," was the first to be installed. All of the side windows are memorial windows given over time by various classes. The first pew features silver plates engraved with the signatures of previous Superintendents. Among them are the names of Generals MacArthur, Taylor, and Westmoreland. Services in Cadet Chapel are conducted for Protestant members of the Corps of Cadets, the faculty and the public. Currently, there is no handicap access to the basement of Cadet Chapel or to the restrooms. Services are at 10:30 a.m. every Sunday. It is open daily from 8:15 a.m. till 4:15 p.m. ATTENTION: There are no ADA bathrooms available at this facility.

## Jewish Chapel



The completion of the Jewish Chapel in 1984 culminated a twenty-year undertaking. The organization responsible for the project was the West Point Jewish Chapel Fund a private, non-profit civilian organization. This group raised over 7.5 million dollars to erect and furnish the facility.

In 1986 the Jewish Chapel was deeded to the Academy. Led by a military chaplain, the congregation serves the needs of various branches of Judaism represented in the Armed Forces. In close connection with the Aleph Institute and the Jewish Welfare Board, worship resources are designed to meet the broad spectrum of our faith.

The Chapel contains an extensive Judaica collection, a fine library, and special exhibits. The Jewish Chapel is open by appointment only Monday-Friday. Sabbath services are held every Friday evening during the academic year at 7:00 p.m.

## Old Cadet Chapel



Although Congress provided in 1818 for the appointment of a civilian Protestant clergyman at West Point, there was no regular chapel building until construction of this neo-classical edifice in 1836. Hence, making the Old Cadet Chapel the first house of worship at the Academy. Originally located in the vicinity of the cadet barracks, because of the sentiment attached to this building after the construction of the "new" cadet chapel, it was removed stone by stone to its present location in 1910.

The interior is the repository for many unusual plaques and other memorabilia including a plaque to the infamous Major General Benedict Arnold.

Because of its location at the entrance of the cemetery, many Funerals and Memorial services are held here. It has also been the home for Lutheran services for many years. (10:30 a.m. Sundays 8:00 a.m. in summer) It is open for meditation and prayer daily from 8:15 a.m. till 4:15 p.m.

Our chaplains provide confidential counseling and mentorship. They also provide cadets with daily opportunities for worship and regular visitation within the cadet-training areas.

Chaplains are religious ministry professionals who support the spiritual resilience of our cadets. They provide pastoral care ministry and 100% confidential counseling and mentorship to those of faith and those of no faith. Chaplains can also offer personal guidance and act as advocates for our cadets.

Home to a variety of faith communities, the [Cadet Chapel](#) also hosts Special Programs in Religious Education (SPIRE), the largest religious education program within the Air Force. Currently SPIRE hosts 14 groups from seven distinct faith backgrounds. Led by qualified and gifted instructors, SPIRE groups meet weekly in a casual environment to focus on spiritual formation and character development. These groups also offer times of worship, community building activities, spiritual retreats and mentorship.

## CADET INTER-FAITH COUNCIL

The Cadet Inter-Faith Council (CIFC) is comprised of cadet representatives from different faith backgrounds who focus on religious education and discussion across the Cadet Wing. 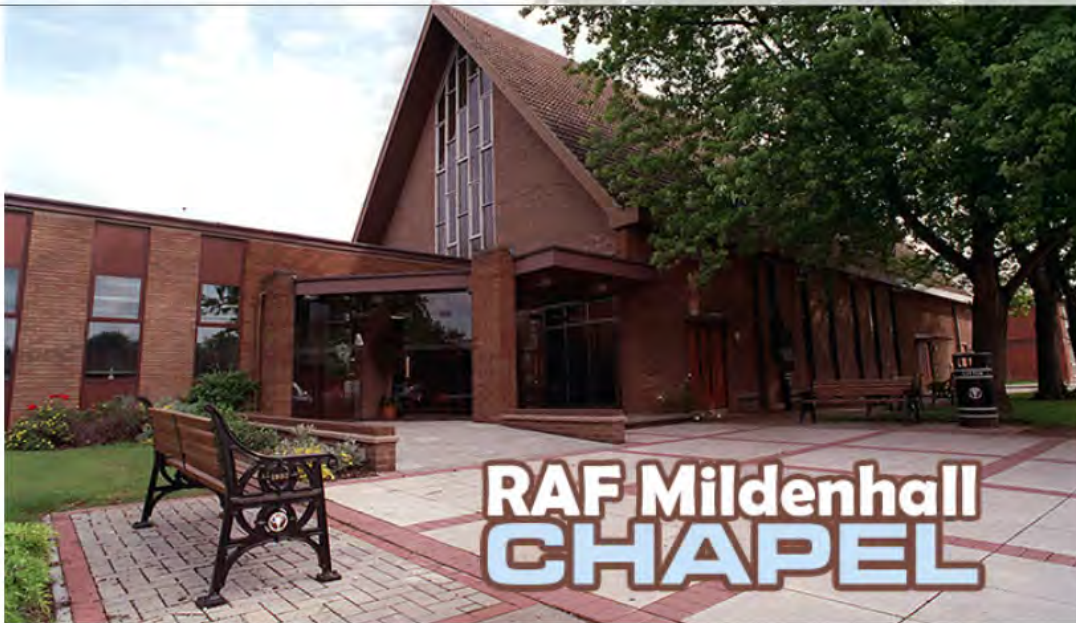

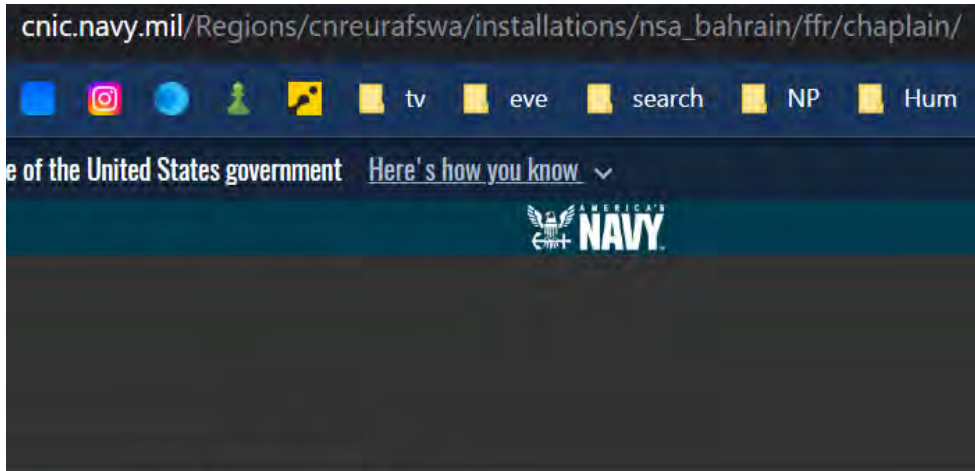

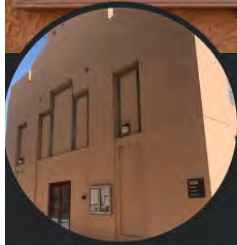
